

🎓 Why Students Struggle in School (It's Not What You Think)

Most students aren't struggling because they can't learn.

👉 They're struggling because of how they've been taught to learn.

🧠 The Hidden Problem

Many students are using ineffective learning strategies.

They've been taught to:

- repeat
- memorize
- push through

But for many learners...

👉 that doesn't work.

Take spelling.

Students are often told to sound everything out.

But you can't even spell "*phonetically*" phonetically.

👉 Strong spellers don't just sound words.

They **see them**.

What Actually Works

When students use:

- ✓ visual strategies
- ✓ pattern recognition
- ✓ movement (kinesthetic learning)

👉 learning becomes easier.

Not because they changed...

👉 but because the strategy did.

A Real Example

I worked with a second-grade student who:

- struggled with focus
- had frequent conflicts
- lacked confidence

In one session, she learned a new way to learn.

Two weeks later...

- 👉 she spelled a 16-letter word
 - 👉 with her eyes closed
 - 👉 while physically moving through each part of it
-

And then she said:

👉 “I feel smart.”

That moment matters.

Because that’s not just learning.

👉 That’s identity.

What Changed?

Not her ability.

👉 Her learning strategy.

And once that changed:

- behavior improved
- confidence increased
- engagement shifted

Students don’t need more pressure.
